The Jewish Cultural Sunday School of Boston Workers Circle is seeking teachers for our 4th and 6th grade classes. The school engages children grades K-7 in an exploration of secular Jewish identity rooted in Jewish cultural literacy and our traditions of social justice.

Requirements:

- Experience working with kids in a camp, informal setting or a classroom
- Experience with implementing curriculum
- Comfort and familiarity with working on Zoom
- Familiarity with Jewish culture, Jewish history, and a commitment to Social Justice work
- Experience supporting students with diverse backgrounds, identities, strengths, and challenges.

Job Responsibilities:

- Design and teach 22 lessons using the BWC curriculum as a guide
- Are available September - June, on 2-3 Sundays a month from 10:30am-12:30pm
- Can come to Boston (in the event we are able to return to in-person teaching)
- Build a warm, welcoming, encouraging, and engaged classroom community
- Attend 6 trainings/teacher meetings throughout the year
- Communicate with families
- Work with education director to implement feedback and get support
- Use Zoom platform to teach lessons

4th Grade Curriculum Themes:

The Daled, 4th grade teacher, would be given a curriculum that focuses on:

Unit One: Jews in Ancient times and the beginning of the Diaspora

Project: archaeological dig

Unit Two: Jews flourishing in Spain and Sephardic Jewry

Unit Three: Diversity of Jews around the World

Project: research countries, cookbook and feast

6th Grade Curriculum Themes:

The Vov, Sixth grade teacher, would be given a curriculum that focuses on themes of:

Unit 1: Identity and Stereotypes

Unit 2: The Holocaust and antisemitism

Unit 3: Israel/Palestine: Cultural Narratives and Ethical Dilemmas
