- Some knowledge of Jewish history and culture.
- A demonstrated commitment to social justice.
- Knowledge of Yiddish and or Ladino is a plus, though not required.
- Knowledge of community organizing is a plus, though not required.
- Availability to teach two to three Sunday mornings each month from **10:00 am - 1:00 pm** (includes set-up and clean-up) in Washington Square, Brookline, MA, from **September 11 - June 6**. Our site is T-accessible, wheelchair accessible and there is street parking.
